BB12Step Meeting Preamble

- We are gathered here because we are faced with the fact that we are powerless over alcohol and are unable to do anything about it without the help of a Power greater than ourselves. (1940 AA Preamble)
- Probably no human power could have relieved our alcoholism. (AA Big Book p.60)
- The simple purpose of our program is to show what may be done to enlist the aid of a Power greater than ourselves.

BB12Step Meeting Preamble

- Rarely have we seen a person fail who has thoroughly followed our program. ... Now you may like this program or you may not, but the fact remains, it works. It is our only chance to recover. (1940 AA Preamble)
- We do not speak for A.A. as a whole and you are free to agree or disagree as you see fit, in fact, it is suggested that you pay no attention to anything which might not be reconciled with what is in the A.A. Big Book. (1940 AA Preamble)

BB12Step Meeting Preamble

- There are no dues or fees. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. Each member squares his debt by helping others to recover.

 (1940 AA Preamble)
- Our REAL PURPOSE is to fit ourselves to be of maximum service to God and the people about us. (AA Big Book p.77)
- Faith must work twenty-four hours a day in and through us or we perish. (1940 AA Preamble)



Big Book (BB) Key Word: Open-minded

def. open-mind·ed/ ō-pən-'mīn-dəd receptive to try new ideas and experiences

<u>SYNONYMS</u>: **receptive**, impartial, unbiased <u>ANTONYMS</u>: **prejudiced**, hardheaded, stubborn, obstinate, close-minded, pigheaded, blind



"Most emphatically we wish to say that any alcoholic capable of honestly facing his problems in the light of our experience can recover, provided he does not close his mind to all spiritual concepts. He can only be defeated by an attitude of intolerance or belligerent denial. ... Willingness, honesty and openmindedness are the essentials of recovery. But these are indispensable." (Appendix II, p.2)

Are you "openminded" OR "hardheaded"?



"Many times we talk to a new man and watch his hope rise as we discuss his alcoholic problems and explain our fellowship. But his face falls when we speak of spiritual matters, especially when we mention God, for we have re-opened a subject which our man thought he had neatly evaded or entirely ignored. We know how he feels. We have shared his honest doubt and prejudice." (p.45)

def. prej·u·dice - a preconceived judgment (closeminded)



"Do I now believe, or am I even willing to believe, that there is a Power greater than myself?" As soon as a man can say that he does believe, or is willing to believe, we emphatically assure him that he is on his way. It has been repeatedly proven among us that upon this simple cornerstone a wonderfully effective spiritual structure can be built."(p.47)

TO BELIEVE...

"Besides a seeming inability to accept much on faith, we often found ourselves handicapped by obstinacy, sensitiveness, and unreasoning prejudice. Many of us have been so touchy that even casual reference to spiritual things make us bristle with antagonism. This sort of thinking had to be abandoned. Though some of us resisted,..."(p.48) (Continued)

Are you openminded? Are you certain? Will you consider the possibility you're not?

(Continued)"Faced with alcoholic destruction we soon became as open minded on spiritual matters as we had tried to be on other questions. In this respect alcohol was a great persuader. It finally beat us into a state of reasonableness. Sometimes this was a tedious process; we hope no one else will be prejudiced for as long as some of us were." (p.48)
