BB12Step Meeting Preamble

BB12Step Meeting Preamble

- We are gathered here because we are faced with the fact that we are powerless over alcohol and are unable to do anything about it without the help of a Power greater than ourselves. (1940 AA Preamble)
- Probably no human power could have relieved our alcoholism. (Big Book p.60)
- The simple purpose of our program is to show what may be done to enlist the aid of a Power greater than ourselves.

(1940 AA Preamble)

BB12Step Meeting Preamble

- Rarely have we seen a person fail who has thoroughly followed our program. ... Now you may like this program or you may not, but the fact remains, it works. It is our only chance to recover. (1940 AA Preamble)
- We do not speak for A.A. as a whole and you are free to agree or disagree as you see fit, in fact, it is suggested that you pay no attention to anything which might not be reconciled with what is in the A.A. Big Book. (1940 AA Preamble)

BB12Step Meeting Preamble

- There are no dues or fees. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. Each member squares his debt by helping others to recover. (1940 AA Preamble)
- Our REAL PURPOSE is to fit ourselves to be of maximum service to God and the people about us. (Big Book p.77) Big Book
- Faith has to work twenty-four hours a day in and through us or we perish. (Big Book p.16) & (1940 AA Preamble)


Key Word: "WILLINGNESS"

Big Book (BB) Key Word: Willingness

def. will-ing-ness / wiliNGnas /

1. the quality of being eager to take action without delay or requiring persuasion. (i.e. speaking the truth; upright conduct)

<u>SYNONYMS</u>: *enthusiasm*, voluntary, compliance ANTONYMS: *procrastination*, reluctance, lazy



BB Key Word: "WILLINGNESS"

- "MOST OF US have been unwilling to admit we were real alcoholics." No person likes to think he is bodily and mentally different from his fellows."(p.30)
- Most alcoholics <u>have to be pretty badly</u> <u>mangled</u> before they really commence to solve their problems."(p.43)
- "If you have decided you want what we have and are willing to go to any length to get it - then you are ready to take certain steps."(p.58) How willing are you?

BB Key Word: "WILLINGNESS"

- What do they mean by "willing to go to any length"? Here's what it looks like:
- "We ... sought the same escape with all the desperation of drowning men." (p.28)

Desperation inspires Willingness

Dr. Bob had a lot willingness – for years he pursued a spiritual means of recovery without success. When convinced by Bill W. of the hopelessness of alcoholism, he took action with a willingness inspired by desperation.
